- 2. Hand Formula (B < P*L)
- 3. The Reasonable Person

BPL Example

Precaution	В	P * L	Total Cost
None	\$0 (or ∞)	\$100k	\$100k
Solar Panels	\$200k	\$0k	\$200k
Spark Arresters	\$30k	\$50k	\$80k

Scenario 1: No precautions available to defendant

Scenario 2: Only solar panels available

Scenario 3: Both solar panels and spark arresters available
